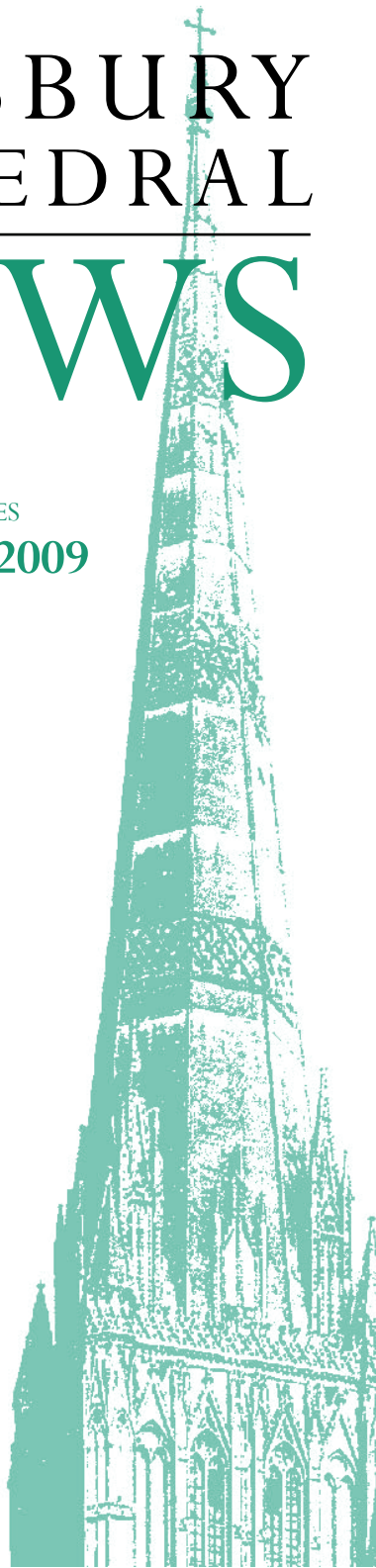

This Exhibition of around 30 religious and secular sculptures brings together recent examples of the sculpture upon which the artist's considerable reputation is based. This is the first time Ball's exquisite work will have been on public view in Salisbury and includes a number of reflective images, several witty conversation pieces and a new *Madonna and Child*. Visitors will be able to see close up his individual figurative style which makes use of found objects, often wood embellished with metal. Open in the Morning Chapel between 10am – 4pm daily. Admission free.
