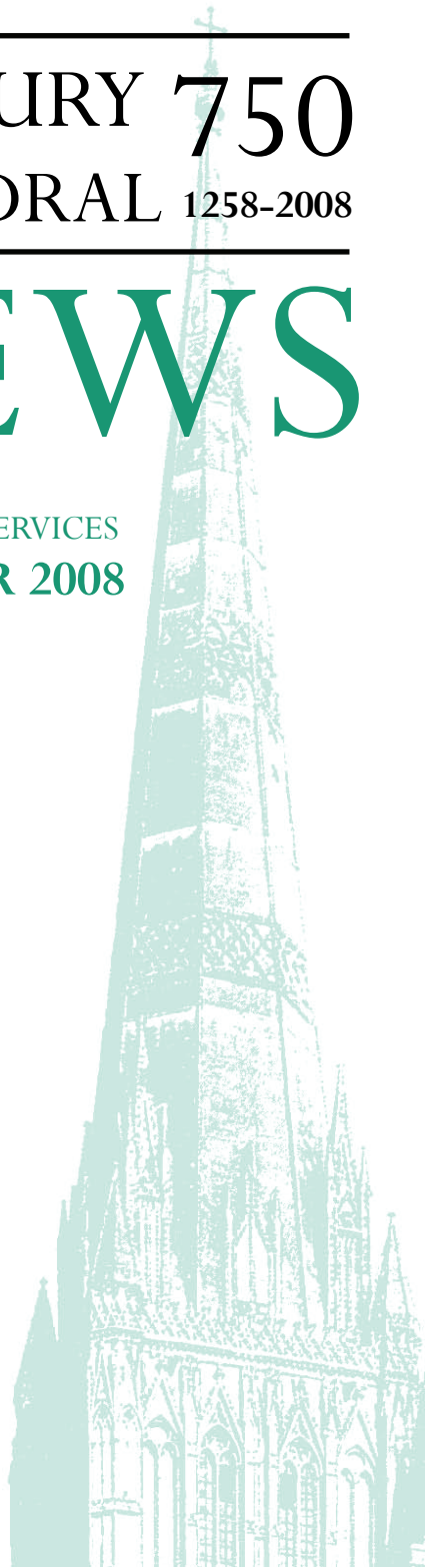

Keith Wright, Durham Cathedral gives an Organ Recital in the Cathedral on Wednesday 10 September at 7.30pm performing a programme of transcriptions of well-known music by Bach/Vivaldi, Byrd, Debussy, Elgar, Schumann, Sweelinck and Wagner. He has been Sub-Organist of Durham Cathedral since 1991. As soloist and

accompanist he has played throughout Europe and in the USA, Canada and Brazil; he broadcasts regularly and has made over twenty commercial recordings. Keith also taught Daniel Cook at Durham many years ago.

The Emery Organ Recital - Michael Harris of St Giles Cathedral, Edinburgh gives the prestigious Emery Recital on Wednesday 8 October at 7.30pm in the Cathedral.

Messiaen Organ Series - On Sunday 14 September at 4.15pm Daniel Cook, Assistant Director of Music at the Cathedral, gives the third in a series of six concerts during which he is performing all Olivier Messiaen's organ works to commemorate the centenary of his birth in 1908. He performs *Méditations sur le Mystère de la Sainte Trinité*, music he considers "unsurpassed in its spirituality and incomparably moving in its intensity".
